## Voting in a Civilised Society

Sunday 25th May, there was a programme on the radio on the concept of cultural ideas between four speakers each presenting their own perspective on identity and 'left' versus 'right' views in politics. The conversation was fairly generalised with each presenting societal values as they perceived them for example standards in education, health, housing and income.

The conversation became a little more heated when for one of the contributors, views on abortion coloured his own concept of 'civilised' socialism. Whether he intended to make an issue of this particularly sensitive subject was unclear but the other three speakers and chairman avoided the politically charged comment. However I noticed the gap widen between the first speaker and his counterpart thereafter no matter what other subject was being debated.

At first my heart sank but then the other speaker deftly broadened the conversation so as not to labour on this one contentious issue. Then I mulled over the impending General Election called for 4th July and recalled one reporter two years ago quizzing an MP on his abortion views where yet again there was a difference of opinion.

Although voting on sensitive matters has been traditionally down to an MP's personal matter of conscience, it turns out that some political parties have tried to pressure their members into making proabortion a matter of policy but I am still under the impression each MP can decide how to vote in their own right. Doctors and nurses have been in a similar position in certain hospital units.

For our own country to be called truly civilised, we should reject the sort of amendment attempted by Diane Johnston and Stella Creasy MPs to the Criminal Justice Bill where it was proposed to extend abortion to birth and be decriminalised. With the UK going to the country to vote that attempt has now failed. This would have dragged back-street abortion into more scandalous and criminal shame. No wonder there was an attempt to decriminalise just in case the amendment was passed.

The assisted suicide debate being introduced by the Scottish Lib Democrats is another attempt to foist a highly dangerous proposal onto the people of Scotland without caring for the most vulnerable the terminally ill. Were it introduced into law it would inextricably broaden to include other conditions - the disabled the elderly and chronic sick- i.e. the thin edge of the wedge expanding criteria which has happened in Canada and Belgium.

A civilised society is one which cares for the whole community where people cannot speak for themselves and where opportunities to live in safety and lead healthy lives should be encouraged and not suppressed.

It will be interesting to see if Candidates feel free to respond to these questions in the short time leading up to 4th July and give us a chance to decide where best to place our vote.

#### Liturgical Calendar

**Tuesday 11th June, St Barnabas, Apostle** - It is not known when he died, but according to Eastern and Western tradition his remains were discovered on this day sometime in the fifth century. A Jew from Cyprus and one of the first converts in Jerusalem, a leading member of the Church there, though not one of the twelve. He introduced Saint Paul to the twelve and worked with him in Antioch and on missionary work in the Mediterranean world. Championed the Gentiles at the Council of Jerusalem. Honoured as "a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith" (Acts 11:21).

**Thursday 13th June, St Anthony of Padua** - Priest, Doctor of the Church. Born in Lisbon (Portugal) in 1195; died at Padua (Italy) on this day in 1231. At first an Augustinian priest and scholar, then became a Franciscan to do missionary work in north Africa but this was thwarted by illness. Instead, he became a teacher of theology and a brilliant popular preacher in southern France and Italy, a servant of the poor, and a worker of miracles.
