The Principal Parts of the Mass

Introductory Rites

The principal function of the Introductory Rites is to ensure that the faithful, who come together as one, establish communion and dispose themselves properly to listen to the word of God and to celebrate the Eucharist worthily. General Instruction of the Roman Missal 46

These rites serve as spiritual exercises in repentance, thanksgiving and praise. They are like the warm-up exercises of an athlete for those coming to do the work of the Liturgy and to be joined with the prayer of the Church. Serving the whole assembly in this way, they are of particular importance to the one to whom is asked to minister the word prayerfully, faithfully and fruitfully.



Liturgy of the Word

The Liturgy of the Word is made up of a number of elements - firstly the word of God, and secondly our word in response (homily, Creed and Prayers of the Faithful). Best practice is to have one reader for each of the different readings of the word of God. Hearing a variety of voices helps the congregation hear the Word; it also more naturally introduces brief times of silence after each reading during which people can ponder and take to heart what has been ministered to them.

On Sundays in ordinary Time the most closely related passages are the First Reading, the Psalm and the Gospel. The first two will have been chosen for their relationship to the Gospel, and so - in their liturgical context - will be best understood (and thus proclaimed) in that context. The Second Reading will not have been chosen because of a relationship with those other three passages, but will have a close sequential reading with the Second Reading from the Sunday before and the Sunday after. Again, context is important. On Sundays in the great seasons of Advent and Christmas, of Lent and Easter, all the elements of the Liturgy of the Word are related to the Gospel and the spirit of the season.

Liturgy of the Eucharist

Nourished by the divine Word, God's faithful have a deeper hunger for the Eucharistic food and drink. The Liturgy of the Word prepares us for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. It gives us fresh reason for thanksgiving, and a keener sense of our dependence on the grace of God.

Communion Rite

The word of God is not forgotten when it comes to the Communion Rite. The Church has consistently encouraged the singing of psalms as the faithful process to Communion. Antiphons and psalms are indicated in the Missal and the *Graduale Simplex* and *Graduale Romanum* for the Entrance and Communion Songs. A community that is being helped by its ministers to develop a love for the Scriptures will find these songs especially helpful.

Concluding Rites

Ministers need to know the power and importance of the dismissal. When we know the dismissal is not just 'the end' but a new sending out of disciples to continue the mission of the Church, we will be encouraged to seek out the pastoral implications of the Scriptures we read. The Scriptures at Mass can be seen as nourishment not only for during the Mass but as food we take away with us, to continue listening to and praying with in the days to come.

Summary of Decree of Amalgamation of St Isidore's, Biggar Into the Parish of St Mary's, Lanark - effective 1st July 2024

As proclaimed at all Masses of obligation on weekend 8th/9th June, Bishop Toal Decrees the following:

- 1. Effective from Midnight 1st July 2024, the Parish of St Isidore's, Biggar, will cease as a separate juridic person in the Church and will be joined with the juridic person which is the neighbouring parish of St Mary's, Lanark: The boundaries of St Mary's, Lanark, will change accordingly to incorporate those of St Isidore's, Biggar.
- 2. Fr John-Paul McShane will continue as Parish Priest of St Mary's, Lanark, and all existing parochial registers form St Isidore's, Biggar will be retain at St Mary's.
- 3. In accordance with the norm of c.121, all of the goods and patrimonial rights and property of St Isidore's, and any obligations with which it be burdened, together with all its existing assets and liabilities shall become the property, rights, obligations, assets and liabilities of St Mary's, Lanark. Furthermore, possession and ownership of all ecclesiastical goods and all objects of artistic or historical value belonging to St Isidore's shall be transferred to St Mary's, Lanark, and shall be administered in accordance of the prescriptions of Canon Law with due regard for the intention of benefactors.
