# Our Lady's Birthday

According to St. Augustine, human nature is restored to its intended form (free from sin) in the conception and birth of Our Lady. It's not anything she did herself to accomplish this, it's all what God has done through her. It's not even something He did to specifically benefit her; it was something He did to benefit all of humanity. Because Mary's pure human nature is then what is handed down to her Son—and it is through His Passion and the Sacraments that the nature of all mankind is redeemed—Mary's birthday really is a very big deal. It is the dawning of God's new creation: our redemption.



We do not usually celebrate the birthdays of the saints. Instead we celebrate the day they died, because that is the day they were born into the joys of heaven. But the birthday of Mary, is an exception. We celebrate her birthday because she came into this world full of grace and because she was to be the Mother of Jesus.

In both the East and West, Mary is the most important of saints. St Matthew describes how, when the angel Gabriel came to her and said: 'Hail favoured one, the Lord is with you', she replied simply: 'Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. Let it be done unto me according to your word.'

When Mary visited her cousin Elizabeth, mother of John the Baptist, Elizabeth said: 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb.' It was on this occasion that Mary sang her beautiful Magnificat:

My soul glorifies the Lord, My spirit rejoices in God my Saviour

The next mention of Mary in the New Testament comes when St Luke recounts the family's journey to Jerusalem when Jesus was 12. Mary, he says, kept everything she saw and learnt of her son in her heart. From time to time, Mary is mentioned during Jesus' public ministry. At the wedding feast, she urges her son to do something when the wine runs out early.

At the crucifixion, according to St John, as Mary stood by the apostle watching her son die, Jesus said to her: "Behold your son" and to John "behold you mother". From that hour the disciple looked after Mary in his own home.

The last mention of Mary in the New Testament, is in the Acts, when we learn that she was with the disciples at Jerusalem when the Holy Spirit came upon them all.







### RCIA - St Mary's

#### Liturgical Calendar

Wednesday 8th September The Birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary - This feast originated in Jerusalem about the sixth century, a development of the feast of the dedication of the church of Saint Anne, built in Jerusalem "where Mary was born." Observed in Rome in the seventh century, it was later used to determine the date of Mary's Immaculate Conception. Because of her importance in salvation history, Mary's birthday is celebrated as well as those of her son Jesus the Lord, and of Saint John the Baptist (24 June).

**Thursday 9th September St Peter Claver, Priest** - Born at Verdú (Spain) in 1580; died in Cartagena (Colombia) on 8 September 1654. Jesuit who felt called to mission work in the New World. Sent to Colombia in 1610 and ordained a presbyter in 1616 in Cartagena, a major port of entry for slaves brought from Africa. For the next thirty-four years, in the face of opposition from slave owners, he met the slave ships with a band of helpers and interpreters and ministered to the physical and spiritual needs of the slaves, catechising and baptising thousands; died after suffering four years of debilitating illness. Peter called himself "the slave of the slaves" and is remembered for his total devotion to their needs and dignity.
