Insurance Premium

Our insurance is high due to the sheer beauty of the church buildings and covers the whole campus (3 grade A listed building). Some ask why we do not "shop around" for our insurance, and the answer is simple: we are insured by Catholic Insurance Service Ltd, owned by the mutuals (Bishops' Conference).

As many of you know, the 300 Club was founded to help cover the cost of our annual insurance premium. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who currently subscribe to the 300 Club, new members and those who have supported it faithfully since it was formed, because without your support we would not financially be able to meet the rising costs associated with insuring our beautiful church.

Some Good Tips for Readers & Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

Readers:

- 1. Please continue to speak clearly whilst projecting your voice directly into the microphone. If you whisper in, then a whisper comes out. If you need to, adjust the microphone before Mass to make sure it is in the correct position.
- 2. For the Universal Prayers of Intercession (Bidding Prayers) please make your way to the ambo during the final few lines of the Creed. The reader should be at the ambo and ready before the priest begins the Opening Prayer.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion:

1. For Communion, can the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion make their way to the sanctuary as soon as the "Lamb of God" begins. Extraordinary Ministers should be in place on the sanctuary for this prayer finishing and facing the altar for the priest saying: "Behold the Lamb of God".
