People often ask me what I enjoy best about being a priest. Immediately my response is 'everything'. That is true. But there are some things I find more rewarding; and one of those things is seeing our churches well attended and people practicing their faith.

For me, I received so much joy this Easter, witnessing the church so full of parishioners and visitors. As always, our naturally beautiful church was looking majestic! The florists worked their magic, and the flowers were outstanding. But, there is so much more that goes on in the background to make these events so special, and to prepare our church so magnificently for our celebrations.


In our parish we certainly have the "full package". We all recognise how beautiful our church looks and the great work of the florists, but we also need to recognise the people who work silently in the background every day/week to keep our church so presentable, and also operational. When I think about the flowers, I of course think about the girls hard work, but I also think about the people who donate money regularly to the Flower Fund, and those who organise the Fund - the work going on in the background. I also think about the team of volunteers who clean our church every second Wednesday - working silently in the background. I also think of those who clean the floors ever week, or buff them once a month - working silently in the background. My mind is also drawn to the sacristans who prepare for Mass each day, to those who prepare the linens and keep them clean and worthy for use; the people who open and close St Mary's every day, allowing people the opportunity for private prayer - working silently in the background.

Thinking about the Liturgy, I think about the Parish Choir, and The Choir of St Mary's, along with our Organists, who volunteer so much of their time to enhance our music liturgy - working hard in the background. I think about the Passkeepers, Welcome Ministry and those who greet us as we enter St Mary's, making us feel at home - the face of St Mary's. I think of the Readers and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion who help us encounter God by their ministry, and take Jesus to the sick - humbly working in the background.

I also recognise the work of those volunteers who are "customer facing" - our gardeners who dedicate so much time to making our grounds look as good as our church, and welcome visitors with a smile and kind word. I particularly think of our wonderful Social Committee who work tirelessly to make the social life of our parish such a success - giving of their time to build up our parish community by their fundraising events and the countless hours of planning and preparation.

A great joy for me this year was to witness so many people attending Mass on Eater Sunday. 587 people attended in St Mary's, and 57 in Holy Trinity. It was heartwarming to see so many families celebrate Easter by coming to Mass and rejoicing in the Risen Christ!

It is evident our parish does not run smoothly because of one person, or one small group, but rather the dedication and commitment of many people and many groups - many cogs making the big wheel turn. To each and every little "cog", to all who play any part in our parish, small or great, thank you for your time, your dedication and your ministry - thank you for making my Easter joy complete.
