

Ordinary Time

Ordinary Time is one of the liturgical seasons in the Catholic Church, providing a framework for worship, reflection, and spiritual growth. It is the longest season of the liturgical calendar and serves as a bridge between the major celebrations of the Christian faith, such as Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. Though its name may suggest simplicity or insignificance, Ordinary Time offers Catholics an essential opportunity to deepen their relationship with God in the context of daily life.


Ordinary Time is so named because its weeks are numbered, derived from the Latin word "ordinalis," which means "numbered" or "ordered." It does not refer to "ordinary" in the sense of mundane, but rather to the structured progression of time. This season is divided into two parts: i) The first segment begins the Monday after the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, usually in early January, and ends on the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday; ii) The second and longer segment begins on the Monday after Pentecost and continues until the Saturday before the First Sunday of Advent. Together, these periods encompass 33 or 34 weeks, depending on the year, and form the backbone of the liturgical year.

The central theme of Ordinary Time is spiritual growth through the teachings and ministry of Jesus Christ. Unlike Advent or Lent, which are penitential and preparatory seasons, Ordinary Time is a time of sustained reflection on the life and mission of Christ. The readings at Mass during this season emphasise Jesus' public ministry, including his miracles, parables, and teachings about the Kingdom of God. Ordinary Time encourages the faithful to live out their discipleship in their daily lives. It provides an opportunity to apply the lessons of Christ's life, death, and resurrection in practical ways. The season emphasises the continuity of God's presence and grace in the ordinary events of life, reminding Catholics that holiness can be found not only in extraordinary moments but also in the routine of daily existence.

Ordinary Time invites Catholics to find God in the ordinary rhythms of life. It challenges the faithful to recognise the sacred in the seemingly mundane and to embrace a steady, faithful commitment to prayer, service, and community. The season also allows for a more deliberate study of Scripture, participation in the sacraments, and engagement in works of mercy. By immersing themselves in the teachings of Christ during Ordinary Time, Catholics are encouraged

to reflect on how they can embody his example in their daily interactions, decisions, and relationships. It is a time to cultivate a faith that is active and integrated into every aspect of life.

Far from being a "less important" time in the liturgical calendar, Ordinary Time provides Catholics with a profound opportunity for spiritual growth and transformation. It is a season that calls the faithful to live out their baptismal promises in the routine and ordinariness of life. By focusing on the life and ministry of Christ, Ordinary Time reminds believers that every moment, no matter how simple, is an opportunity to encounter God and grow in holiness. It is a time to celebrate the extraordinary grace of God in the everyday moments of life.

Meeting with Bishop Brian McGee on the Synod on Synodality



Alpha began at a church called Holy Trinity Brompton (HTB) in London in 1977, it was taken by Nicky Gumbel in 1990 and repositioned as a course for those outside the congregation. The number of people attending Alpha at HTB grew quickly into the hundreds and attracted the attention of other churches across denominations seeking to find an effective tool for evangelism.

Now, all over the world, millions of people have tried Alpha and it has been translated into 112 different languages. The Alpha Talks have been repackaged for today's audience in the Alpha Film Series and the Alpha Youth Series – created to reach a younger generation with the Gospel. Even as times have changed, the Alpha course has continued to be used by the church as an effective tool to reach the lost with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Alpha is a completely FREE 11-week programme that invites people to find out more about faith and ask all those BIG questions that you want to find out more about e.g. Is there more to life than this? Who is Jesus? How can we have faith? etc.
