#### Visiting a Cemetery

The Bible tells us that, "it is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins," (2 Maccabees 12:46) and especially in the month of November, the Catholic Church urges us to spend time in prayer for those who have gone before us. Prayer for the souls in Purgatory is a requirement of Christian charity, and it helps us to call to mind our own mortality.

The Church offers a special plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, on All Souls Day (November 2), but She also encourages us in a special way to continue to keep the Holy Souls in our prayers throughout the first week of November.

#### Why Should We Visit a Cemetery to Pray for the Dead?

The Church offers an Indulgence for a Cemetery Visit that is available as a partial indulgence all year round, but for the month of November this indulgence is plenary. Like the All Souls Day indulgence, it is applicable only to the souls in Purgatory. As a plenary indulgence, it remits all punishment due to sin, which means that simply by performing the requirements of the indulgence, you can obtain the entrance into Heaven of a soul who is currently suffering in Purgatory.

This indulgence for a visit to a cemetery encourages us to spend even the briefest of moments in prayer for the dead in a location that reminds us that we, too, will someday need the prayers of the other members of the Communion of Saints—both those still living and those who have entered into eternal glory. For most of us, the indulgence for a cemetery visit takes only a few minutes, and yet it reaps immense spiritual benefit for the Holy Souls in Purgatory—and for us as well, since those souls whose suffering we ease will pray for us when they enter into Heaven.

#### What Must One Do to Obtain the Indulgence?

To obtain the plenary indulgence during November, we must receive Communion and sacramental Confession (and have no attachment to sin, even venial). Communion must be received each day

we wish to gain the indulgence, but we only need to go to Confession once during the period. A good prayer to recite to earn the indulgence is Eternal Rest, though any formal or informal prayer for the dead will suffice. And, as with all plenary indulgences, we must pray for the intentions of the Holy Father (one Our Father and one Hail Mary) each day we perform the work of the indulgence.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

#### **Annual Requiem Mass**

We have a great tradition in the Church to come together and offer Mass for the faithful departed. This year we will celebrate our Annual Requiem Mass in St Mary's on **Tuesday 23rd November at 7pm**. At this Mass all those who have died since Sept 2020 will be remembered in a special way. All parishioners are encouraged to come along and pray for their loved ones who have died over the years.

#### Liturgical Calendar

Tuesday 9th November Dedication of St John Lateran Basilica - The Lateran Basilica, the cathedral of the diocese of Rome, was dedicated to Christ the Saviour in the fourth century. The anniversary has been celebrated as a feast of the Latin Church on this date since the twelfth century. It honours the local Church of Rome as a link with earliest Christian tradition and as a sign of our communion in Christ.

Wednesday 10th November St Leo the Great - He died in Rome on this day in 461. Elected pope in 440. Tried to protect the city from the devastation of barbarian invasion. His surviving letters illustrate the leadership and guidance he exercised as bishop of Rome toward other Churches in the West. Noted for the clarity of his thought on the two natures of Christ, affirmed at the Council of Chalcedon, for his eloquent sermons, and for the prayers he composed for the Roman liturgy.

Thursday 11th November St Martin of Tours - Born in Pannonia (Hungary) about 316; died in 397 and was buried on this day in Tours (France). A catechumen who was in conscience unable to continue with military service. Baptised at the age of eighteen, for a time became a hermit, and then worked to establish monasticism in the West. Bishop of Tours for twenty-five years. One of the first non-martyrs to be venerated as a saint. Widely remembered for his legendary generosity to the poor, for arguing against the persecution of heretics, and especially for his active evangelisation and pastoral care of rural areas.

Friday 12th November St Josaphat - Born in Vladimir (Ukraine) in 1580; died at Vitebsk (Belarus) on this day in 1623. A Basilian monk who became archbishop of Polotsk. Worked strenuously to uphold and spread the Union of Brest-Litovsk by which Churches of the province of Kiev, with their Byzantine liturgy and customs, had entered into communion with Rome. In a complex situation of national and religious antagonism, he was killed by violent opponents. Noted for his energetic pastoral reform and courageous ecumenism.

#### St Mary's Grant Applications

#### Viridor Credits Grant

From Viridor Credits we received a 50% funding grant totalling £9,257, for the upgrade of the internal and external lighting at St Mary's. Work is progressing very well and the internal work is now complete. Once the external lighting has arrived it will be installed and the work will be completed.

#### Hate Crime Grant

Sadly St Mary's was vandalised several months ago. The front of the chapel house and church was damaged and the Calvary Shrine was also vandalised. Bishop Toal then encouraged the parish to apply for a Hate Crime Grant, available from Police Scotland. With only 36 hours until closing date, we were able to submit our application for new security fencing at the rear of St Mary's and also new CCTV covering the grounds and church. We have now been notified that we have received 100% grant funding totalling £19,109. Work will commence and be completed promptly.

#### Community Funding Grant

The Clubrooms have also been successful in receiving Community Grant funding of £500 to carry out essential roof works and repairs. Once again many thanks to the Community Council for their support and approval of this funding.
