Life Everlasting

Eternal life begins with Baptism. It continues through death and will have no end. The so-called particular of personal judgement occurs at the moment of death of an individual. The general judgement which is also called the Last Judgement, occurs on the Last Day, at the end of the world, when the Lord comes again.

Heaven is the endless moment of love. Nothing more separates us from God, whom our soul loves and has sought our whole life. Together with all the angels and saints we will be able to rejoice forever in and with God.

Purgatory, often imagined as a place, is actually a condition.

Someone who dies in God's grace (and therefore at peace with God and others) but who still needs purification before they can see God face to face is in purgatory. Since all those who are baptised into Christ form one communion and are united with one another, the living can also help the souls of the faithful departed in purgatory. Our love extends into the next life, through our prayer, fasting and good works we can obtain graces for the departed.

Hell is the condition of everlasting separation from God, the absolute absence of love. Someone who consciously and with full consent dies in serious sin, without repenting, and refuses God's merciful, forgiving love forever, excludes themselves from communion with God and the saints.

God does not damn human beings. Humans themselves are the ones who refuse God's merciful love and voluntarily deprive themself of eternal life by excluding themselves from communion with God. God yearns for communion even with the worst sinner; he wants everyone to convert and be saved. Yet God created man to be free and respects our decisions. Even God cannot compel love.

The Last Judgement will take place at the end of the world, at the second coming of Christ. "All who are in their tombs will hear his voice and come forth, those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to judgement" (John 5:29).

We read in St Matthew's Gospel: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on his glorious throne. Before him will be gathered all the nations of the earth, and he will separate them one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will place the sheep at his right hand, but the goats at the left.... And they will go away to eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life".

At the end of time, God will create a new heaven and a new earth. Evil will no longer have any power or attractiveness. The redeemed will stand face to face with God - as his friends. Their yearning for peace and justice will be fulfilled. To behold God will be their blessedness. The Trinity will dwell among them and wipe away every tear from their eyes; there will be no more sorrow, death, lamentation, or trouble. God will be all in all, and we pray and hope that we will be worthy of such a great gift, life eternal with God and all the angels and saints.

Liturgical Calendar

Monday 17th November, St Elizabeth of Hungary, Religious - Born in Bratislava (Slovakia) in 1207. Married at the age of fourteen, widowed at twenty, and died at twenty-four in Marburg (Germany) on this day in 1231. Mother of three children, happily married to Ludwig of Thuringia. When Ludwig died of the plague while on crusade, she continued to protect the poor and founded orphanages and hospitals, living this life of service as a Franciscan tertiary despite the hostility of her relatives and the harshness of her confessor. Noted for her good-humoured resilience in adversity and for her humility in menial service of the needy.

Tuesday 18th November, Dedication of the Basilicas of Saints Peter & Paul, Apostles - Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome, built in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries, and Saint Paul's Basilica, built in the nineteenth century, both replaced older buildings erected by Constantine in the fourth century over the tombs of the apostles Peter and Paul. The dedications of these churches have been commemorated together on this day since the twelfth century. As on 29 June, the universal Church joins the Church of Rome in honouring its apostles.

Friday 21st November, The Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary - This memorial originally marked the dedication of a sixth century church of the Virgin Mary near the Temple of Jerusalem. The East took it up as a celebration of Mary's presentation to God in the Temple at the age of three, a non-biblical story from the apocryphal gospel of James. Established in the West late in the Middle Ages, the feast was universally observed by the sixteenth century. It celebrates Mary in her grace-filled life, wholly given over to the Holy Spirit from the time of her conception.

Saturday 22nd November, St Cecilia, Virgin & Martyr - Though a late fourth century church in Rome was named after her, nothing is known of her life or death. Popular legends were written about her in the late fifth century, and in the sixteenth century she was named the patron of music. Honoured by the Church as a virgin, martyred for the faith, her name is included in Eucharistic Prayer I (The Roman Canon).

Our heating bill averages $\mathfrak{L}1,100$ per week in the winter, keeping all doors closed will not only preserve heat but also save the parish money.

St Mary's Bell Tower Repair Update

We are delighted to let you know that we have been awarded two grants towards the work required on our church tower and spire. The award from Historic Environment Scotland is £11,278. HES have been tremendous supporters of St Mary's for many years having supported the re- roofing of the church and external works during our major renovation project. We are also delighted to have been awarded £10,000 by the National Churches Trust / The National Lottery Heritage Fund and to be part of the outstanding work that they do.

The project has also been supported so well by our parish community and we are very grateful to St Mary's Social Committee who raised and donated £4,000 towards the project. We are custodians of our beautiful church for future generations and are so blessed to have such a centre not just for our community, but for the wider community, both socially and for worship.
