Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

As we enter the month of June, a sacred time in our liturgical calendar, our hearts turn with renewed devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus - that most perfect symbol of divine love, mercy, and sacrifice. The Church, with maternal wisdom, dedicates this month to contemplating and responding to the infinite love that flows from the Heart of Christ, pierced for our salvation.

The devotion to the Sacred Heart is not merely an old tradition; it is a vibrant and living call to encounter the love of Jesus in a deeply personal and transformative way. His Heart, burning with compassion, is not distant from our own struggles, wounds, or fears. Rather, it is a refuge - a place of healing for the broken hearted and strength for the weary. Through the revelations given to St Margaret Mary Alacoque, Christ invited the world to see His Heart as a wellspring of love that grieves for indifference and longs for reciprocal

In this month of June, the Lord invites us not only to gaze upon His Sacred Heart but also to console it. How do we do this? By offering acts of reparation, by receiving the Sacraments with reverence and frequency, and by living lives that reflect His mercy and truth, remembering, especially, the First Friday Devotion, as revealed to St Margaret Mary, and encourage one another to take up this spiritual practice, with its promises of grace and spiritual renewal.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus desires to reign not only in our churches but also in our homes and hearts. I encourage you to enthrone the image of the Sacred Heart in your homes - a beautiful tradition that places Christ at the centre of family life. In doing so, you proclaim your trust in His love and ask Him to sanctify your daily joys and trials.

In a time when many hearts are cold with indifference, hardened by division, or burdened by sorrow, the message of the Sacred Heart is a balm and a summons. It is a balm, because it reminds us that we are always loved and never forgotten. It is a summons, because we are called to become, in the words of St John Eudes, "hearts on fire with the love of Jesus." Let us therefore be ambassadors of this Heart - compassionate in action, faithful in prayer, and courageous in truth.

I invite you this June to renew your devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Let it not be a mere sentiment, but a daily response to His love. Let His Heart shape our parishes, our families, and our personal lives. Let us give Him our hearts, so that He might transform them into instruments of His peace. May the Sacred Heart of Jesus be your refuge, your strength, and your joy.

Most Scared Heart of Jesus, we place our trust in you!

Liturgical Calendar

Tuesday 3rd June, St Charles Lwanga and Companion, Martyrs - They died on this day in 1886. Between 1885 and 1887, these twenty-two martyrs were among many newly baptised Catholics and Anglicans who were killed for their faith and virtue in Uganda by a debauched and brutal ruler. They included judges, catechists, soldiers, and teenage pages under the leadership of Charles Lwanga, who was burned alive. Noted for the heroic calm of their fidelity to Christ.

Thursday 5th June, St Boniface, Martyr - Born in Devon (England) about 675; died in the Netherlands on this day in 754. A monk and teacher who went to evangelise the Germanic peoples. Was ordained bishop and given wideranging papal commissions throughout Germany and Gaul. Founded monasteries and established dioceses, presided at synods, and maintained close associations with various emperors. Honoured as a determined missionary and as a Church organiser and reformer whose work shaped the future of Europe. He is buried at his abbey of Fulda (near Frankfurt).

- 1. Please continue to speak clearly whilst projecting your voice directly into the microphone. If you whisper in, then a whisper comes out. If you need to, adjust the microphone before Mass to make sure it is in the correct position.
- For the Universal Prayers of Intercession (Bidding Prayers) please make your way to the ambo during the final few lines of the Creed. The reader should be at the ambo and ready before the priest begins the Opening Prayer.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion:

For Communion, can the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion make their way to the sanctuary as soon
as the "Lamb of God" begins. Extraordinary Ministers should be in place on the sanctuary for this prayer
finishing and facing the altar for the priest saying: "Behold the Lamb of God".
