

Jesus's Blood Never Failed Me Yet

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as the Feast of Corpus Christi. The feast was proposed by Thomas Aquinas, Doctor of the Church, to Pope Urban IV, in order to create a feast focused solely on the Holy Eucharist, emphasizing the joy of the Eucharist being the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. The proposal followed the recognition in 1264 of the authenticity of the Eucharistic Miracle of Bolsena, Italy, when a consecrated host began to bleed.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (1324), quoting from Lumen Gentium para 11, states that, "The Eucharist is 'the source and summit' of the Christian life. But all too often, I take the Eucharist, its reality and significance, for granted.



One piece of music he recommended was "Jesus' Blood Never Failed Me Yet" by Gavin Bryars, of a homeless man singing an improvised gospel-style lyric. The story of how the track came to be made is fascinating, as Bryars described in an interview:

"In 1971, when I lived in London, I was working with a friend, Alan Power, on a film about people living rough in the area around Elephant and Castle and Waterloo Station. In the course of being filmed, some people broke into drunken song – sometimes bits of opera, sometimes sentimental ballads – and one, who in fact did not drink, sang a religious song "Jesus' Blood Never Failed Me Yet". This was not ultimately used in the film and I was given all the unused sections of tape, including this one. When I played it at home, I found that his singing was in tune with my piano, and I improvised a simple accompaniment."

The resulting track, at about 26 minutes long, is a haunting sound of resilience and hope, a beautiful testimony to this beggar's belief in Jesus. His repeated lyric, "Jesus' Blood never failed me yet, never failed me yet, Jesus' blood never failed me yet, there's one thing I know, for he loves me so..." acknowledges our deepest human need for God and to grow in that longing and that dependence on a daily basis.

According to the Church's liturgical calendar, we are not long the other side of the Passion of our Lord, which culminated in Good Friday with the spilling of Jesus' blood. And yet, here I am again, not to mention every Mass in between, at risk of taking the greatest sacrifice for granted. I pray that meditating on this beggar's heartfelt lyric, giving thanks for Jesus unfailing love for me, will lift me closer to the source and summit of the life He has called me to.

Liturgical Calendar

Monday 3rd June, St Charles Lwanga and companions, Martyrs - They died on this day in 1886. Between 1885 and 1887, these twenty-two martyrs were among many newly baptised Catholics and Anglicans who were killed for their faith and virtue in Uganda by a debauched and brutal ruler. They included judges, catechists, soldiers, and teenage pages under the leadership of Charles Lwanga, who was burned alive. Noted for the heroic calm of their fidelity to Christ.

Wednesday 5th June, St Boniface, Bishop, Martyr - Born in Devon (England) about 675; died in the Netherlands on this day in 754. A monk and teacher who went to evangelise the Germanic peoples. Was ordained bishop and given wide-ranging papal commissions throughout Germany and Gaul. Founded monasteries and established dioceses, presided at synods, and maintained close associations with various emperors. Honoured as a determined missionary and as a Church organiser and reformer whose work shaped the future of Europe. He is buried at his abbey of Fulda (near Frankfurt).

Amalgamation of St Isidore's and St Mary's

Dear Parishioners of St Mary's, Lanark, and St Isidore's, Biggar,

Re: The Amalgamation of the Parish of St Isidore's, Biggar, into the Parish of St Mary's, Lanark:

I am writing to let you know that the proposed Amalgamation of the Parishes of St Mary's, Lanark, and St Isidore's, Biggar, will go ahead. The Amalgamation has been presented and consulted upon in the parishes, and the Council of Priests was consulted at the meeting on 18th April 2024. The Amalgamation will come into effect on Sunday 9th June 2024.

On 9th June the Parish of St Isidore's will be amalgamated into the Parish of St Mary's, Lanark. There will be one Parish, St Mary's, with the worshipping group of St Isidore's as part of St Mary's. I will now draw up the canonical decree putting the Amalgamation into effect and promulgating for your information and keeping it as a record of what is taking place.

My thoughts are with you, and I pray for you all as we look to the future as one parish covering Lanark and Biggar and the surrounding areas.
