Solemnity of the Epiphany 7th January 2024



You're A Blank

I've been thinking about Noah's Ark a lot recently. Perhaps it's the flooding across the UK in recent months that has prompted my reflections on the familiar story of the ship through which God spares Noah, his family, and examples of all the world's animals from a global deluge.

One of the earliest interpretations of the story was by an Early Church Father, Origen of Alexandria (d.253AD). Origen's sermon on Noah's Ark drew heavily on an allegorical, that is symbolic, interpretation of the scriptures proposing the Ark prefigured the Church, the mystical body of Christ.



Just consider how much Origen's vision of the Ark as Church has inspired the physical space of a church building, especially the wonderful Gothic cathedrals. Perhaps an obvious connection is that of the central section of the church called the 'nave' from the Latin, navis, meaning boat. From the inside gaze up at the roof, which looks like an inverted hull of a mighty ship. Then cast your eyes around the walls and pillars and you will see depictions of every type of creation, from leaves and fruit to animals, people, and our heroes in the faith. Also, think here of Notre-Dame especially, where the flying buttresses look like huge oars propelling the building up river.

Origen's exegesis of Noah's Ark story calls to mind the Genesis creation narrative and the primal chaos, which stands for all that is opposed to God's intentions. God's Spirit hovers over it and so God has lordship and dominion over it. For Origen, the spiritual life is all about separating ourselves out from the chaos and sin, so that the dry land can appear and we can flourish. The story of the Bible is one of rescue plans, and so the Ark foreshadows God's ultimate rescue plan, Jesus Christ and his Church, the means by which the rescue plan continues.

To that point, Origen draws attention to the great planks, which make up the outer part of the Ark that protect it from the waves. These planks he says, stand for 'teachers, leaders, zealots in the Church'. Those engaged in teaching and evangelising come up against a culture that opposes them – very often in waves! Origen notes that these planks are covered with pitch on both the outside and inside. The pitch on the outside is the uprightness of our external acts, and the pitch on the inside is the purity of our soul. To a greater or lesser extent we are all evangelists, teachers and leaders, and if we're weak in our external acts, we'll mess us up; and if we're weak in our prayer life, we're going to give way.

When I was at school, to be called a 'plank' meant you were a bit thick, stupid or clumsy. Origen, though, is calling us to be a plank. Are we up to it? As we start a new year, let's make a resolution to be a plank in this great Ark of a Church, praying for protection from the storm and all that is opposed to God's intentions.
