
It is only by coming together in compassion that we can build God's Kingdom here on Earth.



# A reflection from SCIAF God's creation is crying

Read aloud this reflection as part of a prayer service this Lent.

## **“Listen to the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor.”**

Words from Pope Francis that should move us to action.

When you hear a baby cry, it is because there is a need. You can normally solve that need by showing comfort, feeding, changing a nappy, getting them to sleep. And, if after trying all these things, you still have a crying baby, you may seek advice from others to offer their help.

If a friend comes to you crying, it is not supposed to make you feel comfortable. Crying is a natural way for us to show our feelings of hurt and discomfort.

We want to help our friends when they are hurting – we want to do our best to comfort, to listen, and to find solutions to help.

Our earth, God's creation is crying. The truth is that the earth has been crying for a long time, showing signs of distress and mistreatment. It is broken.

What will you do in response to the cry of the earth?

Our broken world and the consequences of climate change are affecting the poorest communities most and worst!

Julius from Malawi says “Climate change has caused a lot of problems in my life, compared to the past. Our main problem is hunger.”

Unfortunately, Julius is one of many experiencing similar problems.

**Can you hear their cry?

## The earth is the Lord's and everything in it!


**"The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it; for he founded it on the seas and established it on the waters."**

# A reflection from SCIAF

## Seeing God in Creation

**“The earth was here before us and it has been given to us.”**

Pope Francis, *Laudato Si'*

Pope Francis reminds us that we are called to experience God through nature. In *Laudato Si'* he points us to the Canadian Bishops who say that: “From panoramic vistas to the tiniest living form, nature is a constant source of wonder and awe. It is also a continuing revelation of the divine.”

Scripture also speaks of encountering God in creation. ‘For since the creation of the world, God’s invisible qualities – his eternal power and divine nature – have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that people are without excuse.’ Romans 1:20

**Creation sings of God’s qualities and magnitudes. We need only look around.**

How clearly the sky reveals God's glory!

Each day announces it to the following day;
